Equipment

Grooveline has an extensive collection of equipment. Grooveline travels with a fulltime sound engineer and a full lighting rig. Grooveline typically requires 2-20 AMP circuits to power the sound system and lighting system. Scott's guitar rig features a PRS custom 24 (personally signed by Paul Reed Smith), a Stratocaster, and a gold top Les Paul Custom thru a vintage (pre-CBS) Fender Super Reverb. Bill plays a custom Spector 6 string bass thru a SWR ported 15" cabinet. Rick is using several controllers and software based synthesizers on a Mac laptop providing a virtually limitless variety of instruments and sounds. Guy is holding down the beat on a vintage set of Tama 9-ply maple drums with Zildjian cymbals. Rob Faber controls the band's overall sound behind a 24-channel digital mixing board. Numerous power amps and outboard gear is used to sweeten the band sound before the mix is sent to the powered Carvin PA speakers, Yamaha monitors, and an 18" Mackie powered sub-woofer.
